As of the beginning of last year I have begun serving as Co-Chair of CUUPS and am also still serving in the position of Ministerial and Right Relations. We have worked together very well as

a board. We are, however, very lean with only 4 board members working to maintain the standards, wants, desires, and focus of the Board and searching for volunteers and possible board members. Along with other board members and volunteers I have worked to inform various groups within the UU Movement, via, Facebook and email, about who we are as a major part of the larger movement, what activities we are engaged in, what resources we have, and how they can plug into our activities. We intend to increase the posting of some of our activities on various social media platforms to inform people how and when we are available to aid in their spiritual search for truth and meaning and in having conversations, when the opportunity arises, to discuss what we are doing as a Board and Affiliate of the UUA. One of the major events to really make contact with chapter members is GA, which was face to face this year.

There was a long lead up to GA and a lot of work done by the board–correspondences, emails, video editing, and many more little things that added up to a lot of work. This included attending meetings and focusing a lot of time and discussion on the General Assembly. We had a booth this year at GA and did a live Solstice Service as well as working to promote an on demand concert on the GA platform of Whova. I spent much time in the booth with CUUPS Board Members, their spouses, and volunteers this year, which was a delight. It was good to see each other face to face after so much time.

We participated in our annual Summer Solstice Service live at GA this year, and I met some people participating in various chapters and had a chance to talk with them face to face, which was a very positive experience.

On the ministerial right relations side, I have been in contact with ministers, as necessary, offering any type of information they might need, and in order for them to become more familiar with what a chapter would mean for the larger institution. I have also made myself available to various groups as needed, and am working within the CUUPS mission and goal to broaden our interactions with other groups and become more multicultural. This year we worked to ease conflicts in many congregations and to find the information and resources available that they could tap into in order to strengthen their chapters and prevent any upcoming conflicts. We have posted some of the links to these resources on our webpage.

We have made a lot of shifts and adjustments because of people needing to step back from the board for various personal reasons, we are still moving forward to help create sacred spaces in our congregations where Pagans and Earth Based Practitioners can come together in a safe, supportive space to deepen their understanding of their spiritual connection as well as find support during these dismal times.

We are looking forward to becoming more inclusive, more diverse, muti-racial, and multicultural, and helping to support and provide space for those who approach the Unitarian Universalist Association with a more Earth Based Spirituality and Pagan perspective. We are an active board working to promote justice, equity, and compassion within our chapters, congregations, and the UUA at large. It is a pleasure serving.

Our membership committee was divided into two defined responsibilities in 2023. We have instituted someone to handle the individual membership things that pop up and more importantly, we have a board member whose responsibility it is to work with, and help grow, our CUUPS chapters across the country.

Individual memberships:

Currently we have approximately 489 members. Our membership numbers have shown stability with previous years. We are forced to be aggressive with memberships not renewed, due to limitations in our subscription service, and "archive" any lapsed members on the 1st and 15th of each month. Should your membership be up for renewal, we hope you renew your membership when the first reminder is delivered by email. This will minimize issues associated with logging in to our website, should your membership be moved to "archived."

The Board would like to thank all of our members, new and renewals, who support CUUPs Continental through donations and membership in our organization. It is a goal of CUUPs to support our members and help them find educational materials as well as ideas on how local leadership can engage their church congregations in Earth-Centered Spiritualities.

Again, CUUPS would love to see a return to a quarterly newsletter for incarcerated Pagans. This program was coordinated with the UU Church of the Larger Fellowship and ceased. We need volunteers who are talented in writing solitary ritual or other educational pieces and would like to get involved in sending these newsletters out to incarcerated Pagans. Chapter Coordinator Report

I joined the Board as Chapter Coordinator on January 1, 2023. My role is to assist and support pagan groups in becoming CUUPS chapters. I advise groups about the advantages of becoming chapters affiliated with their home congregations, which include: access to right relations counseling, liturgy and curriculum resources, networking with other chapters and members throughout the world, cultivating relationships with the larger UU and pagan communities, availability of CUUPS news and announcements on the CUUPS Facebook page, a voice in the public square for pagan and UU values, and contribution to ministries for incarcerated UU pagans. As Chapter Coordinator, I walk pagan groups through the process of applying to become chapters and help them to meet all requirements, such as submitting an application, creating a mission statement, forming a covenant between the chapter and the host congregation, and authorization from the minister or board of the host congregation. Bylaws and other organizational documents may be submitted at the first annual renewal. A CUUPS chapter must include three people who are active voting members of CUUPS Continental as well as members of their home congregations or Church of the Larger Fellowship. Chapters are required to submit an annual renewal form and chapter fee of \$30, unless there are five dues-paying members of CUUPS, in which case dues are waived.

One of our goals this year was to create a Chapter Handbook to guide pagan groups in becoming chapters. It is a comprehensive handbook that describes the process of application to become a chapter and covers many other topics, such as right relations with home congregations, understanding the UU in CUUPS, relationships with congregational governing boards, providing religious education within home congregations, behavioral covenants, media relations, chapter social media, disruptive persons policy, use of the CUUPS logo, finances, fundraising, workshops and discussion groups, educational resources, and much more. Please take a look at the Handbook and let us know if you have any questions or additions for future revisions. If your group is considering, or is in the process of, becoming a chapter, and would like a copy of the Handbook, please contact me for a copy. An addition was made to the CUUPS Statements and Resolutions, found at the end of the Handbook: a CUUPS Resolution on Reproductive Justice and Violence Against Women, which addresses human rights abuses of women.

Since Jan. 1 of my tenure, seven new chapters have been approved; two more are pending. Unfortunately I do not have a record of chapters approved this past year before I joined the Board. There are currently 80 chapters in thirty-five states. If you are interested in forming a chapter, please feel free to contact me at chapters.membership@cuups.org.

Past President / Communications Report








In Person Summer Solstice Ritual at UUA 2023 General Assembly \(/ \text{@ Kishgraphics} \)

- Created and published a newly designed CUUPS Brochure



- providing support for Pagan-identified UU religious professionals and ministerial students; and fostering healing relationships with our mother, the Earth and all her children.
